

Timetable for Submission of Forms for 2011

If you wish to propose a nominee for this prize then please note the following strict deadlines:

1. The name of the nominee and the name of the person making the nomination must be sent to the **The Ahmadiyya Muslim Peace Prize Committee** (the Central Committee) and copied to the **National Amir of your country**.
The Central Committee must receive this information by 31 December 2010.
2. The completed nomination form and relevant evidence must **reach** the National Amir of your country by **31 January 2011**.
(Electronic copies may be emailed to the Central Committee for information, but these must be followed up by hard copies by the National Amirs to be formally accepted by the Central Committee)
3. National Amirs must post hard copies of all nominations received to **the Central Committee and the Committee must receive these by 20 February 2011.**

Late submissions will not be accepted

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Peace Prize

Islam focuses on securing peace in every sphere of human activity. It encourages all to promote education, respect and tolerance, to improve social and interfaith harmony, support charitable causes, foster orphans and serve humanity irrespective of race, creed or colour.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim community is dedicated to establish peace and to protect the basic human rights of all wherever they may be in the world. The community is also keen to recognise efforts made by those who seek to advance the cause of peace.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Peace Prize is awarded in recognition of an individual's or an organisation's contribution to the advancement of the cause of peace.

At the 2009 UK Jalsa Salana (Annual Convention), the Ahmadiyya Muslim Prize for the Advancement of Peace was launched and Hadhrat Ameerul Momineen^(atba) kindly approved that the first prize be awarded to Lord Eric Avebury. The award comprised a trophy together with a certificate and a monetary prize.

CRITERIA

All nominations for the prize are assessed by The Ahmadiyya Muslim Peace Prize Committee against the following criteria:

1. How has the individual's/ organisation's work had a direct impact or led to direct change?

2. How has the impact/change advanced the cause of peace?

Peace, or types of peace applicable could be economic, social, religious, national or international. This might be achieved in a number of ways, including:

- Negotiation/mediation to bring peace to an area;
- Implementation of any major charitable project for the benefit of humanity;
- Development of ideas (eg economic, scientific, political or social) that result in or play a key role in the promotion of peace;
- Playing a leading role in human rights or other causes to highlight particular issues and enable action to promote peace;

Nominees therefore may be from a wide range of backgrounds depending upon the initiatives undertaken **and may include (but are not limited to) journalists, authors, scientists, academics, charity workers, religious leaders, lobbyists, businesspersons, parliamentarians and country leaders.** *(This list is not exhaustive).*

The basis for nomination could be either long-standing service to a particular cause, or a major project/specific idea which has had significant impact and nominations must be supported with objective evidence which is in the public domain.
