Meem Saakinah

The letter Meem with sukoon or Jazm is called Meem Sakinah

Special rules concerning Meem Sakinah

These can be classified into three sets:

- 1) Reading Meem Sakinah with strong nasal sound (Ghunnah)
- 2) Reading Meem Sakinah with light nasal sound (Ghunnah)
- 3) Reading Meem Sakinah without nasal sound (Ghunnah)

Strong Nasal Sound

 Meem Saakinah will be pronounced with strong nasal sound (ghunnah) if it is followed by the letter Meem.

In Arabic terminology it is called: IDGHAAM SHAFAWI

Light Nasal Sound

 Meem Saakinah will be pronounced with light nasal sound (ghunnah) if it is followed by the letter Baa.

In Arabic terminology it is called: IKHFA SHAFAWI

No Nasal Sound

 Meem Saakinah will not be pronounced with nasal sound (ghunnah) if it is followed by any other letter than Baa or Meem

In Arabic terminology it is called: IZHAAR SHAFAWI
