On 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2010, Ḥaḍrat Khalīfatul Masīḥ V ایده اللہ تعالیٰ delivered the Friday Sermon at Baitul Futūh Mosque, London.

In this Sermon Ḥuḍūr ایده اللہ تعالیٰ mentioned some more Aḥmadī martyrs of Lahore and spoke about their family backgrounds, their services, their devotion to the Jamā‘at and their personal qualities. The following is a very brief synopsis of Ḥuḍūr’s ایده اللہ تعالیٰ sermon.

(67) Abdur Rahman Ṣāḥib (21) was a new Aḥmadī. He was doing his MBBS and was martyred in Dārul Zikr.

(68) Nisar Aḥmad Ṣāḥib (46) was martyred in Dārul Zikr as he tried to save Ashraf Bilal Ṣāḥib. His family belonged to Narowal.

(69) Dr. Asghar Yaqoob Khan Ṣāḥib (60) was martyred in Dārul Zikr. He was the grandson of Ḥaḍrat Sheikh Abdur Rashid Khan Ṣāḥib, a Companion of the Promised Messiah علیہ السلام. As a doctor, he served the rich and the poor without distinction.

(70) Ghulām Muḥammad Saeed Dard Ṣāḥib (80) was martyred in Baitun Nūr. His family belonged to Gujrat. His father Ḥaḍrat Mian Muḥammad Yusuf Ṣāḥib and his grandfather Ḥaḍrat Hidayatullah Ṣāḥib were Companions of the Promised Messiah علیہ السلام. He was employed in the National Bank and had the honour of performing the Hajj six times as well as numerous *umras*.

(71) Muḥammad Yahya Khan Ṣāḥib (77) was martyred in Baitun Nūr. His father Ḥaḍrat Malik Muḥammad Abdullah Ṣāḥib and grandfather Ḥaḍrat Barkat Ali Ṣāḥib were Companions of the Promised Messiah علیہ السلام. He was a very kind and modest person.

(72) Dr. Umar Aḥmad Ṣāḥib (31) was seriously injured in Dārul Zikr and died in hospital on 4<sup>th</sup> June 2010. He was among the descendants of Ḥaḍrat Munshi Abdul Aziz Ṣāḥib, a Companion of the Promised Messiah علیہ السلام. He was a veterinary doctor.

(73) La‘al Khan Nāṣir Ṣāḥib (52) was martyred in Baitun Nūr. He belonged to Adrahma, District Sargodha. He was a budget accounts officer of the 17<sup>th</sup> grade. He had the honour to serve as Qaid and then Amīr of District Muzaffargarh.

(74) Zafar Iqbal Ṣāḥib (59) of Arifwala, District Layyah, was martyred in Dārul Zikr. He performed the Hajj five times and many *umras*. He ran a transport business.

(75) Mansoor Aḥmad Şāḥib (36) of Shahdarah, Lahore, was martyred in Dārul Zikr. He was employed in an import and export company and had great zeal for serving humanity.

(76) Mubarak Ali Awan Şāḥib (59) was from Qasur. He was martyred in Dārul Zikr. His grandfather Mian Nizam Din Şāḥib and his great grandfather were the first in the family to accept Aḥmadiyyat despite strong opposition. He was a maternal grandson of Ḥaḍrat Maulana Muḥammad Ishaq Şāḥib, a Companion of the Promised Messiah عليه السلام. He was employed in the Education Department.

(77) Atiq-ur-Rahman Zafar Şāḥib (55) of Saidanwali Gharbi, District Sialkot was martyred in Dārul Zikr. He accepted Aḥmadiyyat in 1988 and his wife also joined the Jamā'at a year later. He ran a personal business and was an excellent preacher of Aḥmadiyyat.

(78) Mahmood Aḥmad Şāḥib (53) was martyred in Dārul Zikr. His grandfather Umar Din Şāḥib Vaince and great grandfather Ḥaḍrat Karim Baksh Şāḥib were Companions of the Promised Messiah عليه السلام. For fifteen years he had been serving as a security guard in Dārul Zikr.

Ḥuḍūr أيده الله تعالى said he would continue with the remembrance of the martyrs in the next sermon.

Ḥuḍūr also informed the Jamā'at of the sad demise of Sarwar Sultana Şāḥiba, wife of the late Maulana Abdul Malik Khan Şāḥib and spoke about her steadfastness and services for the Jamā'at. Ḥuḍūr أيده الله تعالى prayed that Allāh may grant her a lofty station in heaven and announced that he would lead her *Namaz Janazah Ghā'ib* after the Jumu'a.
