Many thanks for your kind letter, without date, which has caught up with me during my peregrinations of the last three and a half weeks. I was out of The Hague from September 16 till yesterday afternoon when I returned back here.

I hope and pray that you may find admission in the University of Georgia for your LL.M. and that you may be enabled to complete your course there successfully.

As you say you are studying the English translation of the Holy Quran I would suggest that during the course of your study you should develop the habit of reflecting over the inner meaning of all that you read and to go on carrying out an inner check-up in the sense that whenever you come across an admonition try to appraise to what degree you are conforming to it both in respect to positive commandments and negative injunctions. This process would help safeguard you completely against that which may be harmful and help you on the road of positive progress. When you start on this process you would naturally be urged on to pray that you may be safeguarded and that you may be enabled to go forward in all positive directions. The Quran is full of very comprehensive prayers and you can go on selecting such of them for particular attention as you may feel are appropriate to you.
